1001	2001	3001	One large scrapbook containing suitable eye-catching pictures for children ages 2-3. (i.e.: colors and animals)
1002	2002	3002	One large scrapbook containing suitable eye-catching pictures for children ages 4-5. (i.e.: numbers and letters)
1003	2003	3003	Personal Safety Scrapbook containing information on being safe in the community; (i.e.: on the streets, in the malls, etc.)
1004	2004	3004	“Home Alone” Scrapbook containing information on survival skills information every child and babysitter needs to know.
1005	2005	3005	Baby Sitting Kit – with index cards attached to the bag securely – cards explain the contents and the reason for their choice, including the age of the child for which the kit was prepared. Kit will be judged on creativity and variety, homemade activities and crafts, suitability for 4-to-6-hour babysitting job and must include a small first aid kit, flashlight and a sheet of emergency information (parent and doctor contacts, allergies, etc.).
1006	2006	3006	Homemade Toy – should be able to explain age group for which toy is made, how it is used, and any safety features. Toys judged on creativity and neatness of construction.
1007	2007	3007	Homemade Toys – the exhibit should consist of 3 different\ kinds of toys, one homemade doll or animal, and one wooden item. Toys judged on creativity and neatness of construction.
1008	2008	3008	Homemade Game – The exhibit should consist of one game. Game is judged on creativity and neatness of construction as well as the presentation of game rules.
1009	2009	3009	Homemade Games – The exhibit should consist of two games. Games are judged on creativity and neatness of construction as well as the presentation of game rules
1010	2010	3010	Child-Care Reference Book – should contain short articles and pictures on childcare that are clipped from magazines. Include information on feeding, play, preparation for nap or bedtime.
1011	2011	3011	Flannel board with one story illustrated. Flannel board judged on neatness, originality, and presentation of story.
1012	2012	3012	Handmade Story Book telling an original story- it can be made of cloth, mixed media or hand painted/drawn. Tell the age of the child for which the story will be told.

1013	2013	3013	Handmade Story Book telling a story that already exist - it can be made of cloth, mixed media or hand painted/drawn. Tell the age of the child for which the story will be told.
