Entries must be completed online at www.carrollcountyfair.com. Entry fees need to be paid by credit card only. No late entries will be accepted.

Due to proposed Maryland budgetary constraints that are beyond the control of the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair Board, Inc., the Board reserves the right to withhold a portion of premium monies, up to and including all of an exhibitor's earned premium payment, for the 2025 4-H/FFA Fair.

- A signed Maryland Show Ring Code of Ethics must accompany entry forms.
- Exhibitors must be enrolled in a dairy goat or veterinary science project to enter the Dairy Goat Department.
- Exhibitors must comply with the 2025 regulations as set forth by the Maryland Department of Agriculture – Animal Health Section, Fair and Show Requirements. Exhibitors must present the “approved” animal health certificate prior to taking animals from the truck or trailer at the fairgrounds. Please note that Maryland’s “Intrastate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection” requires a Scrapie Premises Number.

NEW THIS YEAR:

ALL dairy goats (dry goats & milkers) are permitted to leave at the end of the dairy goat show. ALL pens **MUST** be cleaned out and aisle ways swept.

Exhibitors may choose to leave **dry goats only** at the fair for display purposes. Each **FAMILY** that wishes to display their dry goats will have 1 pen to use. Goats must be comfortably & reasonably spaced in pen – **NO CROWDING**. Display goats must leave the fairgrounds by 8:00 a.m. Thursday July 31, 2025. Pens **MUST** be cleaned out and aisle ways swept.

RULES AND REGULATIONS – Dairy Goat Department

- **Regarding Electrolytes:**
“Feeds and supplements approved for livestock use may be used by exhibitors. If an exhibitor feels their animal needs electrolytes due to health concerns of the animal, they may be administered by recommendation of a veterinarian and by the veterinarian, and in the presence of the Department Superintendents.”
- **Regarding Veterinary Care and Payment of Veterinary Services:**
“When an animal is in need of veterinary care while on the Fair Grounds the Department Superintendent must be notified. When an animal requires veterinary treatment while at the Fair, you may use the veterinarian on the grounds at your cost, call your veterinarian at your cost or remove your animal from the Fair.”
- **Regarding Rules:**
“All exhibitors are expected to follow all 4-H and FFA rules, including the Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Ethics and Welfare, General Fair rules, Livestock Sale Committee rules and Department rules for each specific species being exhibited by 4-H and FFA exhibitors.”

1. All exhibitors must abide by all general rules and livestock requirements that pertain to the Goat project, all club and project animal rules, and conduct themselves in an honest and sportsmanlike manner. Failure to comply with these regulations could result in forfeiture of premiums.
2. This show will be conducted following the rules of the American Dairy Goat Association.
3. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class in breed classes. Only one entry per exhibitor will be allowed in each group class.
4. All pen assignments are final.
5. All goats must be registered or recorded in the exhibitor's name prior to June 1 of the current year. Kids born up to June 1st may be shown at the Fair provided the dam (mother) was owned by the June 1st deadline. No goats will be permitted without official ADGA paperwork and proper health papers signed by a veterinarian.
6. All junior kids MUST be weaned. No nursing or bottle-fed kids are permitted at the fair.
7. Base date for determining age for classes will be the date of the show at the Fair.
8. Exhibitors may exhibit only those animals meeting their project animal requirements, which include a) females only; b) no horns – animals must be neatly dehorned, disbudded or hornless; c) tattooed – permanent identification and clearly readable; d) recorded or registered – all animals must be recorded or registered by the American Dairy Goat Association. (An animal without known ancestry may be recorded as a Native on Appearance).
9. There is to be no clipping in the aisle of the barn. Final trims and touch-ups are to be done at a designated time and place as determined by the Superintendent.
10. All milking does will be permitted to arrive on the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. on the morning of the Dairy Goat Show.
11. ALL dairy goats (dry goats & milkers) are permitted to leave at the end of the dairy goat show.
12. Dairy goats nominated for Fitting & Showing, Best Bred & Owned, Dam and Daughter, Get of Sire, and Produce of Dam will be finalized at check-in. No changes will be accepted after that time. Substitutions will be permitted in the event of illness or death of a previously entered goat.
13. Exhibitors entering the Best Bred & Owned class must be the registered owner of the dam at the time of breeding and kidding.
14. Breed class and milker class substitutions will be permitted in the event of illness or death of a previously entered goat. Substitutions meeting these requirements will be allowed during check-in only. The substitution must have health papers and ADGA registration papers. The substitution MUST be the SAME BREED and SAME AGE as the previously entered goat.
15. Group classes may be made up of one individual exhibitor or two exhibitors may combine for an entry (unless otherwise stated in class). All goats shown in group classes must have been shown in their regular breed class.
16. Premiums for group classes cannot be split between exhibitors. The premium will be awarded to the exhibitor who entered the class.

17. Feeding and caring for animals at the fair is the responsibility of the exhibitor. The exhibitor must handle all work in a timely manner, preferably no later than 9am. If there is any issue, the exhibitor is to immediately call the superintendent to make other arrangements.
18. Exhibitors MUST stay in the showring until the judge concludes his/her reasons for placing the class. Any exhibitor who leaves the showring while the judge is still speaking risks losing their premiums.
19. All goats must be wearing a collar on the day of the show and at any time the animals are out of their designated areas. Appropriate show collars would be a small chain link collar.
20. The Dairy Goat show time is firm. Exhibitors entered in other projects that are on the same day as the show must plan accordingly. The dairy goat committee will provide show programs no later than 7:30 am on the day of the show so that exhibitors are aware of their class(es)
21. Premiums – Fitting & Showing - \$5
Breed Classes – 1st - \$10; 2nd - \$9; 3rd - \$8; 4th - \$7; 5th - \$6.50; all below \$6

Fitting and Showing – RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Classes are offered for Novice, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior age exhibitors. The novice class is for any exhibitor of any age who is a first-year dairy goat exhibitor.
2. Champion Challenge class is offered only for exhibitors who are previous Grand Champion Fitting and Showmanship winners at the Carroll Co. 4-H/FFA Fair and who are currently enrolled in 4-H or FFA and currently exhibiting dairy goats at the Carroll Co. 4-H/FFA Fair.
3. Any 4-H or FFA member showing a dairy goat for their first year may have fitting assistance from

parents, Carroll County 4-H or FFA members or leaders.
